#### Report from Cllr David Kendall, Chair of Finance, Assets, Investment & Recovery Committee



It is now seven months since the local elections, and it feels like a good time to take stock of the progress we're making on the priorities we outlined in May and to set out our aims for the coming year. I think we've made a good start, but there's much more to do.

Brentwood Borough Council, like many local authorities, are working hard to manage its budget in testing financial times. There will be tough decisions ahead that will need to be made; however, we continue to make great strides that will improve the Borough for those who reside here, work here or visit us.

#### A new cinema for **Brentwood**

In 2021, the Council purchased the Baytree Centre, and earlier this year planning approval was granted to redevelop the site. Detailed designs are presently being worked on, following which we will move to award the contract, with building work to start in the later part of 2024 or early 2025.

The exciting news is that in what will be a fantastic facility, the Council is in talks with major cinema operators. This redeveloped shopping centre will become a focal point of the High Street, breathing new life into the town whilst complementing what is already there.

These are exciting times, and we are only just getting started. Below are some of the other activities we have been undertaking on key issues for local residents.

#### £2 million boost for business

Businesses in Brentwood, Shenfield and Ingatestone have voted to create a unique **Business Improvement District** (BID) that will secure £2 million to be spent on improving the area. Thanks to some great work by the Brentwood Business Partnership, the new BID will now deliver projects that will ensure our town centres continue to thrive. Our new BID will be led and driven by the businesses themselves and this funding and commitment of collaboration with the Council will enable the bid to build on the areas' unique strengths and assets. #### **Challenging the Norwich to Tilbury Pylons programme**

The Council has made clear that National Grid's planned reinforcement of the electricity grid infrastructure should take an offshore approach. We oppose the current proposals that would impact residents across the Borough, particularly in Ingatestone and Havering's Grove, in Hutton. We have highlighted significant negative heritage, landscape, agricultural and visual effects the overhead transmission line is likely to have on both areas, and called for, at a minimum, rerouting or underground options in both transmission sites.

#### **Public Transport** and ULEZ

We asked the Mayor of London to reconsider the timing of ULEZ's extension and called for London's scrappage scheme to be extended to neighbouring areas. We continue to make strong arguments for more investment in our public transport services, including support for Brentwood Access Group's calls to add a lift to Brentwood Station, and for a new bus service between Brentwood and Upminster Station.

#### Report from Cllr Dr Tim Barrett, Chair of the Housing, Health & Community Committee



### New social housing for Brentwood

As Chair of Housing, Health and Community Committee, I am extremely proud that since May 2023, we have begun commissioning the largest expansion in Social Housing in the Borough of Brentwood in generations. Proposals to utilise existing council land and sites, like garages or derelict housing, have now reached the stage where contractors will soon be appointed for the first projects. These new homes will be highquality, low-carbon and energyefficient, designed to serve the future generations of our community.

## Investment in events and local sport

This summer, we saw the completion of the King George's development and all new resources available to local people. Our expanded Family Fun Days have continued to be a

success across the Borough, with new events this year in some of our parishes, and we are working with key groups across the community to explore new ways to work together to improve the lives of the people of Brentwood. With our sports teams, we have been actively reaching out to rebuild partnerships and recognise their key contribution.

## Enhancing Health & Wellbeing

Working with key local services and agencies, we are in the process of finalising a new Health & Wellbeing Strategy for Brentwood with a focus on four key themes: Community Resilience; Mental Health Support; the Cost of Living Crisis; and Active Environments. Working more effectively together on these ambitions, greater benefits and outcomes for residents are possible.

## **Support in the Cost of Living Crisis**

In the cost of living crisis, too many residents have been forced into renting housing that is not at an acceptable standard and not effectively managed. We will investigate routes to improve the standards in privately rented accommodation, with all options on the table.

## A new Cultural Vision for our Borough

We are developing a new cultural vision for Brentwood, working with local businesses and the community to enhance our pride in our Borough and maintain what makes it special for so many of us. Together, even in these challenging times, we are working hard to build a better Brentwood.

#### Report from Cllr Barry Aspinell, Chair of the Clean and Green Committee



A key strand of our ambition for Brentwood is made clear in our new policy committee – and it aims to do for

Brentwood exactly what it says in its name! We want to improve our environment and focus on the issues that we know matter to you – our residents.

Investing to improve the cleanliness of our Borough, including exploring innovative ways to tackle flytipping, dealing with litter and principally improving the street cleansing of our High Streets - along with dealing with pavement parking – are all issues high on our list for the coming year.

Since the elections in May, I'm also pleased that, at long last, Brentwood has joined hundreds of other local authorities in declaring a Climate Emergency – but that is just the start. We know the council has a role to play in taking action to reduce carbon emissions – both within our operations and by facilitating wider change throughout the Borough. That is why we have made a statement of ambition by bringing forward the Council's target for achieving carbon net-zero by ten years to 2030 and building a plan to make it possible.

## Public toilets in Brentwood High Street

Both the male and female toilets in the block had unfortunately been closed since February 2023 following serious vandalism. The Changing Places facility was unaffected and has remained open.

We were keen to do what we can to get these toilets reopened but also ensure they are better than they were before. It was also important to make sure a dedicated cleaning regime is in place so that people want to use them.

Currently, the necessary repairs are being carried out in order to be able to reopen them, and unintrusive monitors are also being installed to make it possible to see how frequently the toilets are used, as numbers are currently unknown.

#### **EV** chargers

The expansion of EV chargers across the borough has been continuing, with installations taking place in King George's Park and Chatham Way car park in Brentwood Town Centre. We will be looking to expand these points to the areas of Shenfield and Ingatestone.

#### **Our woodlands**

We are so fortunate to have such a magnificent and wide variety of trees in our Borough, and we want to keep it that way. We are at the beginning of undertaking a programme of woodland management in order to protect and maintain the health of our woodlands for now and the future, making sure our Borough remains a green oasis for decades to come.

#### **Our parkland**

Brentwood is fortunate to have substantial areas of open parkland which are accessible for public use. We are working on creative ways these spaces can be managed and enhanced to provide the fullest enjoyment opportunities for our residents.

In the summer, I joined former England and Essex Cricket Captain, Graham Gooch and members of the Brentwood Environmental Business Alliance (BEBA) at Hutton Country Park where 120 bat willows have been planted that, in about 20 years, will be harvested and turned into cricket bats.

## Introduction of the Community Infrastructure Levy next year

On 15 January 2024, the Council will be introducing a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) for new developments. From this date, all planning permissions issued which are included in the Charging Schedule are liable to pay CIL.



## Why introduce a levy in the Borough?

The CIL funds received will contribute towards local infrastructure projects that are needed to support new developments, such as schools, health services, leisure, open spaces and transport improvements.

#### How will the levy work?

The charge is set on a £/sqm basis and can be levied for a single dwelling unit or for 100sqm net additional floorspace and over. There are certain exemptions from CIL and these include affordable housing, self-build housing, residential extensions, annexes and development by charities.

#### How does it work?


An automated message is sent to your mobile phone the day before your collection to remind you to put out your waste and recycling. We may also use the service to alert you of any changes to the refuse service.
